Barbara Walker MBE (b. 1964)

Barbara Walker MBE is a British artist based in Birmingham in the UK. She studied Art and Design at the University of Central England Birmingham and completed post-graduate studies at Wolverhampton University. Her work is informed by the social, political and cultural realities that affect her life and the lives of those around her. Growing up in the Black community in Birmingham, her experiences have directly shaped a practice concerned with issues of class and power, gender, race, representation and belonging. Her figurative drawings and paintings tell contemporary stories hinged on historical circumstances, making them universally understood and reflecting a human perspective on the state of affairs in her native Britain and elsewhere. Walker was appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) in 2019.
