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## **Artist Biography**

# Jasper Johns (b. 1930)

Jasper Johns was born in America in 1930. He is an American painter and printmaker and a forerunner of Pop art. He studied at the University of South Carolina before completing two years military service. From 1952 he lived in New York where he became friends with Robert Rauschenberg, the dancer Merce Cunningham and John Cage. He made his first 'Flag', 'Target' and 'Number' paintings in 1954 and 1955. In 1958 he had his first oneman exhibition at the Leo Castelli Gallery, New York which won him immediate recognition. Since 1960 he has made nearly 300 lithographs, etchings, screenprints, and embossed paper and lead reliefs. In 1963 he was appointed the Director of the Foundation for Contemporary Performance Arts, he is also the Artistic Adviser to Merce Cunningham Dance Company. He lives in New York.
